Academic Happenings in the classroom:

Each month, I thought I would include some of the academic learning going on in the classroom. Please remember this is only a small snapshot but it will give you can idea of some of academic learning taking place.

Each classroom: On April 13th our community continues learning from the 7 Grandfather Teachings. The focus for April is Humility and the animal is the wolf. The district Indigenous teacher, Diane Barclay, will be sharing these lessons with us. This is part of our framework school goal #3.

Academic Snapshot:

Room 1: Focus is on home reading, flash cards, pre-writing activities. Mrs. Miller recommends having students print out some of their sight words as an at home activity to support what she does in class.

Room 2: Focus for April reading, writing activities, data collecting and graphing for math. Students will be starting a drama unit this month.

Room 3: Double digit subtraction, making change, 3-D shapes in geometry, Math centres. Room 5: Learning about money, non-standard measurements, physical and chemical change, Earth day lessons.

Room 6: Gratitude journals and lapbooks, reading the novel, The One and Only Bob, Biomes and Fractions.

Room 7: Fractions, Speeches, documentary/newsletter project on an animal of choice.

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
